

### **DON'T 'GIVE UP' ON LENT!**

Well, we've said goodbye to Christmas and Epiphany is almost behind us. Already the focus of the Church Calendar is turning to Lent as a time of preparation for Holy Week and Easter. February 17<sup>th</sup> is Ash Wednesday – the start of Lent.

Lent is traditionally a time of fasting, penitence, and self-examination with the aim of trying to put right those things which are wrong in our lives. To avoid the temptation of eating all the wrong things in Lent, the idea was to get rid of them from the house by the previous evening – hence the feasting and festivities of 'Pancake Day' (otherwise known as Shrove Tuesday or Mardi Gras). Then, when it comes to Ash Wednesday, we are able to be more reflective. The intention is not to be miserable - nor to make other people miserable but to recognise our own frailty and mortality, and with it our need of God's help and his gift of eternal life. At our special service on the evening of Ash Wednesday, people are invited (though not obliged) to come forward to kneel at the altar rail and to have the sign on the cross made on their forehead using ash – a traditional mark of repentance and sorrow. At the 'imposition of ash' the following phrase is used. "Remember that you are but dust, and to dust you shall return. Turn away from sin and be faithful to Christ." Sometimes, we try to forget our mortality - yet to do so can also have the effect of us failing to make the best of life. Lent encourages us to value every moment we have as a gift from God. It also helps us to appreciate the simple pleasures of life rather than always be striving for that which is just beyond our grasp. It is a time for meeting with others for prayer and Bible study – something which can be a lot more exciting and fulfilling than it sounds. Lent also, by focussing on our mortality, helps us to glimpse eternity more clearly and to understand just what Jesus has done for us in defeating the power of death and opening the way to eternal life in heaven.

So please don't think of Lent as being about 'giving up chocolate'. It is a positive season of forty days, aiming to cleanse mind and soul (and body if it needs it!) and to open ourselves up to receive all the good things that God has for us. Come and join us at Stoneleigh Church on Ash Wednesday at 7pm, or contact me for details of other Lent opportunities.

# **STONELEIGH NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH**

We have had only one burglary since the last magazine. This was between 16 November and 5 December in Hall Close. A padlock on a garage was forced, a pressure washer and a microwave cooker were stolen. Well, since then, the weather has had one benefit: no crime reported to me. Sadly that does not apply to Warwick University where there have been a lot of burglaries. There have also been thefts from vehicles in Baginton, Bubbenhall and a lorry in a lay-by on the A46. You will know about the very sad case of the lady who was killed trying to stop thieves stealing her car. Foolishly she had left the engine running to warm up the car, something seen most mornings in Stoneleigh during the cold weather, despite many published warnings. We all tend to think it won't happen to me.

The police have issued a warning about a firm saying they are approved by the police and want to come and give you a free consultation on the security of your property. They are not approved by the police who have issued previous warnings about them, published in this magazine in earlier years.

If you did not attend the meeting of Warwick Rural East Community Forum on 21 January, you should put the next one in your diary. It will be in Offchurch Village Hall on 22 April. These meetings allow us to discuss problems with the police and set priorities. They also consider and approve grant applications of things of benefit to our village. For example, the January meeting considered an application for a CCTV camera and in the past approved grants for a rain shelter for young people to use. The police are usually at the meeting an hour early for informal discussions. They also visit all villages with their mobile office to meet us for the same reason. Something which you have failed to do in the past. Therefore you may care to note that they will be in the Village Hall car park again from 16.00 to 16.30 hours on 17 April. It is no good complaining about the police if you are not prepared to talk to them.

### RECIPE

#### WHITE HOUSE PECAN PIE.

This recipe was obtained by Hazel Wozencroft on a recent visit to the United States. It is recognised as a White House speciality having been devised by Mrs Zephyr Wright who has cooked for the President for many years.

Ingredients:

<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> cup butter	1 cup sugar	1 cup dark corn syrup	
<sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> teaspoon salt	1 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>2</sub> teaspoons vanilla	3 eggs	
2 cups coarsely chopped pecans			
Fluted unbaked pastry	shell in a 9 inch plate	or pie pan	

Allow the butter to stand in a covered medium mixing bowl at room temperature until it is extremely soft. Add sugar, corn syrup, salt and vanilla and, with a sturdy hand rotary beater or mixing spoon, beat until thoroughly blended. Add the eggs and beat gently until just blended. Fold in the pecans. Pour into the pastry shell.

Bake in a moderate (375 degrees f) oven on a rack directly below the centre rack until the top is roasted brown and the filling is set in the centre when the pie is gently shaken - about 40 to 50 minutes. Pastry edge should be browned and the bottom pastry a pale gold.

If the top of the pie gets too brown towards the end of the baking time, place a tent of foil over it.

Cool on a wire rack. If desired, serve with unsweetened whipped cream.
