

This month we begin a series of extracts from the diary of the late Mr Harry Edmunds, Shirley Ball's father. He was born in 1897, and later in life wrote down his reminiscences about life and events in Stoneleigh. His diary presents a fascinating insight into the village's history in the first half of the twentieth century.

The cover picture (from Shirley's collection) for this month's edition of the *Stoneleigh & Ashow News* has been chosen to reflect this first extract, as it shows the old bridge at the foot of Motslow Hill.



When the river went over Stoneleigh Bridge

1900: the big flood, when G Keen and H. Hibbert were drowned. Hibbert was found the same day and G. Keen was found in the back water at Stoneleigh Abbey. The river rose very quickly and my mother took us down to the church and the water was level with the stone at the church door. From there she took us down to Walton's Field and we were just in time to see a fowl pen full of chickens go floating down the river, and when we were coming back home, Mr Adcock had just been to get the Co-Op horse out of his stable and he told my mother he was lucky to be alive: the water nearly took him away as it was up the sides of the horse. The next day we went to see the bridge at Motslow Hill and the water had lifted the bridge off its buttresses and it lay on the side of the river.

Meetings

The March Ordinary Council Meeting will be held at the Ashow Village Club, Ashow, on 11th March 2010 starting at 7.00p.m. Please note earlier time. At this meeting there will be a presentation by Andrew Murphy (who is working with the owner of the Old Garage in Stoneleigh) showing plans that he has drawn up for a proposed property on the site of the Old Garage. Also there will be a presentation by Jane Coates, Localities and Communities Officer, Warwick District on "Working with Parish Plans".

Parking outside the Almshouses - Stoneleigh

It has come to the notice of the Parish Council that some motorists are parking across the paths leading from the almshouses thus making it difficult for the residents. Warwickshire County Council has agreed to paint Access Protection Markings which hopefully will relieve this problem. This should happen in the next two months. In the mean time if you park outside the almshouses will you please park with consideration to the residents.

Shrubbery overhanging the Footpaths

It has been brought to the attention of the Parish Council that there are a few houses in Stoneleigh village where shrubs have been allowed to overhang pavements thus making it difficult for residents to walk safely along these paths. Google Street maps

You may be aware that it is now possible to see an image of your house or street on Google Maps, from a *street view* ie not an aerial picture. Although the images are not "live", some people might object on grounds of privacy to having their property visible in this way. You might feel uncomfortable about your car being seen, for example, although Google does blur images to avoid car registration numbers being seen.

STONELEIGH NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

Two crimes have been reported to me this month. One of these was rather surprising, since it was mid day in a very visible location, the Village hall car park. A car parked there for an event in the Hall, on Tuesday 2 February, had both number plates screwed off and stolen. The second was on the night of 17 February in Vicarage Road. A BMW car was broken into, and a camera and some other items were stolen.

A perhaps more worrying event, again in the Village Hall car park, was at about 6.30 pm on 22 January, when three young girls were playing hide and seek and a man shouted and swore at them. They were frightened and ran away. One fell over and hurt herself. One parent immediately went back but the man had gone, in what is believed to have been a small silver car. Again the police would like any more information available on this.

Sadly thefts continue at Warwick University and the police warn us all not to leave anything which might appeal to thieves on view, especially computers. I'm back! Did you miss me?

As I write this, I have recently returned from two weeks in the Swiss ski resort of Wengen. While I cannot deny that I had a good time enjoying the skiing and the resort, it was a 'working holiday'. As some of you know, I was there to act as Chaplain of the English Church in Wengen (St. Bernard's). The church has been there since 1928, originally planted to serve the British skiing community who had formed the "Downhill Only Club" – which celebrated its 85th anniversary while I was out there. Now, along with a similar church in Zermatt, there is a much greater focus on reaching out to the English-speaking community rather than simply holding Sunday worship for the 'faithful'. Both Wengen and Zermatt churches are owned and maintained by the Intercontinental Church Society (ICS), based at Tachbrook Park, Warwick. I have been involved with ICS for nearly 20 years, sometimes acting as a chaplain in both summer and winter seasons in France and Switzerland, and for six years as permanent chaplain to the English-speaking community in Lyon. Since 2002, I have been a member of the Council of the society and so am very committed to their work - which is a major reason why I looked to move to this area in 2008.

So what have I been up to in Wengen for two weeks? Well, I have to admit that I had an easier time than some of the previous chaplains this winter. You will probably have read about the young English man who disappeared in Wengen over Christmas and whose body was found the following week. Tragedies of that magnitude may be rare, but our Chaplains become deeply involved with these and with lesser problems too. Nothing serious happened on my 'shift', but there were still opportunities for building relationships with residents, seasonal workers and holiday makers, for offering a listening ear and a compassionate word, and for sharing the good news of the Gospel in conversation and in Sunday worship.



I also led a memorial service for a Nottinghamshire farmer who had been a regular in Wengen for some 70 years, and who died last year following complications after a serious skiing accident. And, yes, I enjoyed some good skiing, good food and good company.

Thank you to those who supported me through prayer while I was away, and those who looked after the ministry in the parishes here.
