HS2 LATEST

In late November HS2 Ltd published a 50,000 page 'Environmental Consultation' in which full details were given of the current proposals for the route of HS2, together with descriptions of the likely impact the project will have before, during and after construction.

The deadline for comment *was* 24 January which is generally agreed as being far too short a period, not only given the length of the documents but the fact that the consultation period included Christmas and New Year when many people (including HS2 Ltd staff who were supposed to be on hand to answer queries) were on holiday; also several omissions and errors in the documents have been identified.

The details are mind-boggling although even a cursory glance at the documents indicate that little or no notice has been taken of the many requests for mitigation which action groups along the route have proposed. However, publicity about the size of the document has meant that more people have now realised the extent to which they will be personally affected in the short term - not only with such possible problems as selling property but also the likely effects on communities of road closures etc. during construction; in our area, the *Kenilworth Weekly News* has alerted readers to the likely problems.

Much publicity has also been given to the fact that the Government failed to publish a highly critical report produced by its own watchdog body the Major Projects Authority. Despite this publicity and numerous highly critical articles and broadcasts, it seems that the Government is determined to press ahead with the project, although continued all-party agreement is cited as a condition. The deadline has been extended until **Monday 10th February** due to procedural irregularities (i.e. the omission of 877 pages of information) and you can send your responses to:

Please note that the HS2 Ltd website is no longer operational. Relevant documents were transferred to the official Government website just as the Environmental Statement was published!

For me those moments are infused with prayer, which can be as simple as sitting in the quiet church building or, as I did earlier, walking quietly along. Our beautiful church buildings and churchyards lend themselves to this – use the space – I am praying that will help.

Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard

The Orchard group would like to thank all those who attended the December tree planting and in doing so have helped to add to the amenity of this area of the village.

The Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard is looked after by a small Committee of volunteers and most of the work in establishing the orchard and then its upkeep has been done by you the villagers. The land had been generously allocated by the Meadows Society.

The original funding for the orchard was money from Defra and the EU through the LEADER group. The LEADER money has long since run out and for the last year or two we have been funding the management of the orchard from money donated by villagers who wished to become "friends of the orchard".

The general upkeep of the orchard consists of looking after the trees and grass cutting. Other funds have been spent on additional trees and wild flower seed.

This year we are hoping to help commemorate the 100th anniversary of the start of the 1st World War by planting an area in the vicinity of the "Victory Oak" with poppies as well as other assorted wild flowers.

Obviously the upkeep and the investment in poppies will cost money so please can I ask that more and more of you consider becoming "friends of the orchard" and donate just $\pounds 10$ a year to this excellent community project.


