**I**n October we had a meeting with a difference! Vic Nock gave a fascinating talk on the history of archery, demonstrating different bows, arrows and all their accessories. # HS2 Update

**Q**uite a lot has happened in the last month and – somewhat surprisingly, given all the media attention around the US Presidential election and ongoing Brexit discussions – HS2 has featured regularly in national and local press stories.

Despite continuing criticisms about the project from official bodies, and little evidence of public support, on 14<sup>th</sup> November the Government announced the route for Phase 2 of the project. A consultation will now take place, but there is already uproar, e.g. part of a new housing development outside Sheffield will have to be demolished if one particular proposal is implemented. All statements made by the Transport Secretary, Chris Grayling, indicate the Government's continued support for the overall project and Royal Assent is expected early in 2017.

Closer to home, discussions are ongoing with Warwick District Council and Warwickshire County Council regarding the impact of HS2 in this area. To confuse matters even further, it has recently been announced that plans have been put forward for a series of roadworks/alterations to be completed *before* work on HS2 begins, the objective being to improve general access in the area *and* to facilitate the eventual movement of HS2 construction traffic. A decision is expected on this early in 2017. Meanwhile, the Parish Council is pressing for a Stoneleigh bypass to be considered as a matter of urgency.

The StAG annual general meeting is due to be held on 29<sup>th</sup> November. The work of the group will continue in the foreseeable future as more detailed plans about local bridges, pumping stations, fences which – in addition to the obvious issues arising from the track and catenaries – will have a big impact on residents, and we need to be able to liaise with Warwick District Council on these issues. # Born in a barn?...

One of my friends at school was easily irritated by doors that were left open – I think she felt the cold easily. She had a particular way of yelling after anyone who left a door open - "Were you born in barn?". We mostly call it a stable. It certainly wasn't the guest room in a house, or even their own home, and today it might be more equivalent to being offered a bit of space in someone's garage – but Jesus was born in a barn. As we decorate our homes and think of gifts that will make our loved ones know that they are treasured, others in our own country and across the world will find themselves in very different circumstances from our own. Jesus was born a refugee and, on that first night of his life, relied on the kindness of strangers as his parents found themselves without a bed for the night.

As you will know, Stoneleigh Church is still a building site and the congregation has been meeting in different venues. Worshipping in the Village Hall and in the Club is continuing until Easter, and Ashow Church continues to host the united service on first Sundays and its regular pattern of worship. For me, the opportunity to use different venues is really positive – bringing us closer together, inviting creativity and informality, and rooting our prayer in the community and across parishes. I did get a bit worried when looking for a suitable venue for our very popular carol service though. As many of you will know, there was a poignancy to the search when I could find "no room"!

But we now have a very exciting venue thanks to the generous hospitality of the Kennel Club (and some really fruitful conversations on the way)! Do join us for **Stoneleigh Carol Service on Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> December at 7.00pm in the Kennel Club Building in Stoneleigh Park.** The location is easy – just past the barrier and to the left. Parking, access and facilities are easy – and you are welcome to bring your dog! At this service, we will be inviting an offertory which will go directly to the Salvation Army who work with the homeless in Leamington. We have no costs because the Kennel Club is allowing us to use the premises free of charge.



We would love to welcome you to our services in both Stoneleigh and Ashow over the Christmas period. Details are listed on the back page of magazine. I also want to highlight the venues for our crib service and midnight communion so that you know where to find us on our travels! **The crib service will be at 5.00pm on Christmas Eve at Stoneleigh Village Hall** and is an all-age service. We will have extra tea towels for you to borrow but, if you remember and would like to, please **come dressed as a shepherd.**

Many of you enjoyed hosting the posada nativity set last year, and we will once again be sending two sets around our communities. Posada is a Spanish word meaning 'inn' and the tradition originated in Mexico. The modern-day posada encourages us to give a home to the nativity figures of Mary and Joseph for a night. It comes in a bag with suggestions and resources to enjoy this special way of sharing in the preparations for Christmas. The travelling posada symbolises making room for Jesus in our hearts, homes and communities. Each night during Advent, it is hoped that the figures will visit a different house in our communities. Each host chooses who to contact and pass the nativity set on to for the next night but, if you are not sure who to pass it on to or would like to receive it and haven't, please contact me (details below). This year, a flock of sheep will be travelling in the bags - please keep one of the sheep to look after and bring to the crib service.

Following last orders at **Stoneleigh Club on Christmas Eve at 11.30pm**, we will celebrate the first communion of Christmas with a midnight service. I think this year's opportunity to come together round the tables and the hearth in the Village Club will be uniquely special and I hope that you can stay on and join us.

# Stoneleigh Church Building News

**T**he contractors are now in the fifteenth week of their 21 week contract and continue to report that they are working to programme and making good progress.

Masonry work defrazzing, repointing and replacing stonework is continuing on the east end and on the north and south walls. The scaffolding canopy over the nave is now in place and has enabled the work on replacing the roof to proceed, protected from the elements. All copper, underlying felt, chipboard, insulation and the plasterboard ceiling have been removed and replaced by fresh timberwork on top of raised timbers over the existing rafters. Ceiling board underneath is in place, ready to receive plaster. The new outer cover is due to be installed in the next few weeks.

Work inside has progressed with both high and low levels of replastering to the nave walls identified for commencement once work on the roof and ceiling has finished. Scaffolding in the south aisle still has to be erected to enable the decoration of the interior to take place after plastering.




As to the fundraising appeal, the total raised to date is about £60,000 which,, while being about £20,000 short of our target, still enables us to do the internal decorating and some extra stonework that lack of funds had prevented us from tackling. Despite this, a number of national charities we have approached have reported an inability to support our appeal, citing Brexit or low interest

rates as a reason. I am also conscious that the Chancellor of the Exchequer's autumn statement will be made on 23<sup>rd</sup> November and this, traditionally, is the time when a decision is made whether or not to continue the Listed Places of Worship grant scheme under which we can claim back VAT on the cost of the work and professional charges.

## Stoneleigh Community Orchard

**I**t has now been five years since the inception of the Stoneleigh Community Orchard and, as a part of a seasonal reflection, it is worth considering the journey that the Stoneleigh Orchard group has made during that time.

As a project, the progress of the tree planting is there for the entire community to observe, a task that we intend to complete over this coming winter. For those members of the community who have attended Stoneleigh Village Club on orchard quiz nights, there may also be some familiarity with the cider in addition to the great success that has been made of these events by Richard Gledhill and Mandy Smith, the most recent being back on 22<sup>nd</sup> October, which was an outstanding night.

What is not so apparent is what has been achieved as a result of the hard work going on behind the scenes - not only those who have turned up to harvest and process the crop (with special reference to John Churchley), but also those who regularly attend our meetings, offer guidance and assist in helming the project.

The start of the project set out some broad objectives such as providing a community resource and focus, enhancing both the amenity and biodiversity of the area, pulling people together, and not to mention the production of a quality craft cider! These objectives have, by and large, been achieved. This year has concentrated our minds on how to meet our final objective of making the orchard self-sustaining; a requirement that exceeds informal arrangements. To date, this has led to the signing of a formal agreement with the Meadows Society, the acquisition of insurance to cover our activities, as well as agreement permitting the cider to be sold to the Village Club. Regulatory food hygiene requirements have also been met. A final stage will be to address the demands of HMRC so that the orchard becomes what they describe as a legal entity and thus is allowed to formally sell the produce.

To this end, the Orchard Group will most likely have to restructure, a process that will involve consultation with all friends of the orchard, so please do attend our meetings.

The Orchard friends' subscriptions comes up for renewal at the start of the new year and renewals of £10 can be made to Pete Freeman (Chairman) or to Richard Hancox (Treasurer). Cheques should be made payable to Stoneleigh Village Community Orchard. Alternatively, why not become a long-term friend and set up a direct debit?

It is apparent that 2017 already promises to be yet another demanding year for the group, so let's look forward to this and start by wishing everyone season's greetings and a happy New Year!
