

### **Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update**

The December edition of the *S & A News* referred to the group's wassailing event to be held in the orchard on the evening of January 19. As could be expected at that time of year the weather was both unpredictable and inclement. This didn't stop the event organisers from pressing ahead as planned, as well as a large crowd from assembling on what turned out to be a very enjoyable, amusing and successful evening.





Wassailing is an ancient custom originating from the West Country that occurs on the twelfth night in accordance with the old "Julian Calendar". On this night apple trees are exhorted to fruit well in the following season. Stoneleigh Orchard group were faithful to the customs surrounding this event. A crowd, some unusually dressed in period clothing and led by the Coventry Mummers, assembled at Stoneleigh Village Club, then paraded down Church Lane following behind a suitably decorated vehicle driven by one of the organisers, Adrian Clarke. A Green Man playing an accordion headed the parade as the procession made a noisy "din" by banging pots and pans and other instruments en route to the orchard as is the custom to scare away evil spirits! Once at the end of Church Lane the crowd were entertained by a

performance under a lamp light of the "Ploughman's Play" courtesy of the excellent Coventry Mummers. A mulled cider, created by Mandy Smith and served by Elaine James and Mel Statham, fortified the procession prior to entering the impressively torch lit orchard, exuding an air of mystique! Three trees at various locations throughout the orchard were selected and addressed with ancient rhymes of both encouragement and threat from Ann Lowe "The Orchard Queen", and others of the group. This culminated, much to the amusement of the crowd, in a firearm being discharged through the branches of the trees. The crowd then hung toast from the branches and soaked the roots of each tree in last year's cider.

At the Victory Oak a brief "sing song" occurred around a roaring fire griddle basket, prior to returning to the Club for a delicious spread served thanks to head chef, Lynda Rice.

All those who attended agreed that given the success of the evening this may well lead to the wassail featuring as an annual event! Thanks to Ann Lowe and Jules Storer for coming up with the idea as well as providing an excellent poster to advertise the evening!

The group will follow this up with an Orchard Quiz intended to be held on the evening of Saturday, March 23<sup>rd</sup> at 19:00 in Stoneleigh Village Club.

The Annual General Meeting of the Stoneleigh Village Hall and Playing Fields Charity is to be held on Monday 8 April 2019 at 7.30pm at Stoneleigh Village Hall, Birmingham Road, Stoneleigh.

All inhabitants of the parish of Stoneleigh who are eighteen years and upwards are entitled to attend and vote at the Annual General Meeting.

#### **HS2 UPDATE**

All households should have received a leaflet from HS2 Ltd - 'Early Work Notification Stoneleigh Park' - which outlines proposed work from February to June involving 'temporary traffic management for safe vegetation removal along the A46 near Stoneleigh Park, and the B4115'. This may well involve lane closures on the A46 and therefore inconvenience for many residents. There are several issues about the timing of these works, not least that they coincide with the nesting season when the law states that no trees etc. should be disturbed during that period.

The last month has seen even greater media coverage of issues associated with HS2 Ltd, not least about rising costs. An edition of the Channel 4 programme 'Dispatches' on 11 February was devoted to HS2 and numerous criticisms were raised in addition to costs, including whether the project should be scrapped in favour of improving commuter lines (especially in the North) and rail travel east/west. During the 14 February edition of 'Question Time', "Should HS2 be scrapped" was greeted with loud applause and many critical comments were made during the discussion.

Local attempts by the Parish Council continue regarding communication and mitigation. Compensation for rural property and disturbance to residents living over 300 mm from the proposed line is being questioned. It is two years since the House of Lords recommendation that this be considered but HS2 Ltd decline to take action. This matter will be raised again with Jeremy Wright MP in the near future as our area will be at the centre of extensive works with no compensation.

#### Balance by Edwina Gately

So much struggling – realising that I need a balance between reaching out and reaching in.

I need to do some things just for me, like paint and play, and read and build sandcastles.

I need to stop - for a long time, to think about that.

Where did I miss it? Lose it?

For joy is the centre of ministry, Joy should precede ministry, nurture it and fulfil it.

But I am so intense about ministry, and take it so solemnly (as if I were responsible for it)

that I become weighed down by its ups and downs, its disappointments and failures.

I suffocate joy with seriousness.,.. I imagine everything depends on me – when everything is God's business,

and God has already taken care of all her creation and all her people,

We are only to walk with each other, be with each other, love each other.

God's is the healing, the growing and the fulfilling.

When I lose perspective and imagine everything, (or most things) revolving round myself,

I make myself a little god, and lose my joy.

For I was never made to be a little god – only to be loved by the Great God.

Perhaps I am too busy trying to love other people instead of learning to love myself.

When I can do that I might begin to understand how great God's love is.

When I go through darkness, heaviness and anxiety,

it is God's invitation for me to stop looking outwards and start looking inwards and be loving and gentle with myself.

I am called to minister for my own joy. When my joy diminishes, so does my ministry.

When I have fun and enjoy myself, God does! Then I am most like God — who is joy!

'Ministry' is anything we do that serves others, parenting, teaching, building, nursing, volunteering....the list is endless and so it seems is the call on our time in our activity driven culture.

If this poem spoke to you as it spoke to me then maybe this Lent, beginning March 6<sup>th</sup>, instead of giving up those things that give you joy give up one or two of those things that enslave you to overactivity.

Delete those apps on your electronic devices that you know waste time or keep you forever anxious.

Remove that item from your to-do list that has been on there for weeks – maybe it doesn't need doing after all?

Resolve to stop doing one thing each week and see if anyone notices it has not been done. If they do, ask them if they would like to help you by taking it on.

And with the time you save give yourself permission to enjoy free time and just be.

We are after all human beings!

May Lent bring you rest and restoration.

#### SOME ADVICE ABOUT DODGY PHONE CALLS

If your phone rings but no one is there when you answer, if you dial 1471 you can get the number of whoever called you. If you do not recognise the number, do *not* phone them back. However, if you use the Internet, type the number into the Google search box, and you will be directed to a site called 'Who Phoned Me'. That site includes invaluable information about a range of scams. If the number is from a dodgy source it will be listed there.

The system also works if you speak to an unknown person on the phone who you realise is an "unwanted phone call"; after putting the phone down, again dial 1471 and if a number is given, follow the same advice. Sometimes details of the scam and the yarn spun is given on 'Who Phoned Me'.

We all need to be increasingly vigilant as more and more authentic-sounding phone calls (and also email messages) are being sent.

#### **Meetings**

At the **February meeting** of the Parish Council, there was discussion about the emerging results of the Birmingham Road consultation undertaken by Warwickshire County Council. It does not appear that there was overwhelming support for any one of the options put forward, so more work will have to be done to see how best to take this issue forward. It is likely that a representative from Warwickshire County Council will come along to a Parish Council meeting in the next month or so in order to discuss the results of the consultation and see how the parish wants to proceed. If you are interested in coming along and contributing to the discussion, check the meeting agenda posted on the village noticeboards to see when WCC will be joining us.

The **lime tree** on the triangle junction in Stoneleigh will soon be removed by Warwickshire County Council due to the extent and spread of a decay organism that is present on the tree, meaning that it has been deemed a safety hazard. The Parish Council will be looking to replace the tree over the next few months and would like to hear if residents have a preference as to the type of tree it is replaced with, particularly as some people have commented that they would like a different variety this time due to the sticky sap that the lime tree produced. If you have a preference, please let us know by emailing the Clerk at <a href="mailto:stoneleighashowparishcouncil@gmail.com">stoneleighashowparishcouncil@gmail.com</a>.
