Reminder



If a problem suddenly stops the heart pumping blood around the body, it is usually because something has interrupted the heart's electrical impulses and they have become chaotic.

It is not a heart attack, though a heart attack may cause it. It is immediately critical and every minute's delay, in defibrillation, to restore the electrical impulses to normal, and CPR is critical to survival.

That is why there are two defibrillators in Stoneleigh: one in the old phone box and the other outside the Village Hall. They are the same make and model.

We hope never to have to use them but, in case we do have to, we are updating and expanding the team of volunteers trained in CPR and using the defibrillators, and their training. The current volunteers and their numbers can be found on the opposite page.

If you are one of the existing team, please contact me to confirm that you wish to remain a responder and partake in a refresher course, or no longer wish to be a responder.






Stoneleigh History Society

The History Society exhibition on the life of Stoneleigh during key dates in the life of King Charles (1948, 1958 and 1969) will remain in the Leigh Chapel throughout the summer. Have you been to see it yet? You may recognise some of your family in the newspaper articles...

Stoneleigh Community Orchard CIC update

In late April and timed to coincide with the first orchard blossoms, the processing of cider taken from our fermentation containers commenced. Readers may recall from last autumn that we managed to fill containers amounting to some 1700 litres following the pressing that occurred throughout the harvest of 2022. The next step in the process centred on pumping the cider out of the tanks to leave the sediment also known as the "lees" behind. The cider is then decanted into bags which are then heated up and pasteurized to prevent any further fermentation that may cause the bags to explode. On cooling the bags are placed into boxes which are then badged with the Stoneleigh label.

Given the enormity of last year's harvest, the orchard board have this year opted to send a 200 litre portion of our cider to be processed at the Pershore bottling plant in Worcestershire. This has been scheduled to occur on Tuesday 23rd May and at the time of writing we keep our fingers crossed that bottled cider will be available in time for our "Blossom event" on Whit Bank Holiday Monday (29th May). Irrespective of this, the sales of our bag-in-box offering have been brisk and continue to maintain its popularity.

Stoneleigh Perry has also proved popular this year with boxes of perry displaying our new label developed with thanks to the assistance of Jules Storer, and showing an illustration based on a "tongue-in-cheek" and flippant depiction of a legend peculiar to Stoneleigh involving a passing cyclist whose actions briefly led to a "prohibition" on the sale of alcohol within our village. Perry is a similar product to cider albeit produced from Perry Pears. The process of Perry production is more complex than for cider and requires more steps, volumes are also smaller; as a result it is priced a little higher than cider.

Product diversity is currently key to trying to address our product volumes difficulties and with this in mind I also hope to report on the long term possibilities surrounding the development of a Stoneleigh Apple Brandy in the next edition.

Finally, in spite of poor and inconsistent weather conditions throughout May I trust that villagers found time to take a look at the orchard blossom this spring and that spirits were elevated as a result.



Coronation Celebration

Sunday 7th May was sunny and bright, drawing many parishioners and visitors to the Coronation Praise Service at Stoneleigh.


The hymns, music and prayers chosen for the Service reflected that of the previous day and the beginning of a new era.

The congregation enjoyed reminiscences and photos from Shirley Ball of how Stoneleigh celebrated the Queen's Coronation 70 years ago, with a party at the Victory Hall and the planting of two Horse Chestnut trees on The Green. Others recalled squeezing into neighbours' living rooms to watch the Coronation on small black and white television sets, some of which had been bought or hired just for the occasion.



Note the weather was wet on June 2nd 1953 much like the weather on Saturday 6th May 2023





Robin Bussell recalled being on HMS Devonshire and having to move the TV aerial around to allow those below deck to enjoy the televised occasion, which meant he did not get to see the coronation.

Gordon Gatward shared his memories of meeting the then Prince of Wales numerous times and how he was interested in everyone he met, putting them at ease.

Whenever the next Coronation is celebrated, we can remember fondly how the Village celebrated the Coronation of King Charles III, and Douglas Faulconbridge may recall his invitation to the Coronation Concert at Windsor Castle, where he was representing the Scouts of Warwickshire. Warwickshire Scouts Join In Coronation Concert at Windsor

Local Stoneleigh resident, Douglas Faulconbridge, was one of six Scouts from Warwickshire who were lucky enough to attend the Coronation Concert at Windsor Castle.

Tim Cox, President of Scouts in Warwickshire allocated six tickets for Scouts (and six tickets for Guides) in Warwickshire and these were allocated to three Scout Youth Commissioners. Kenilworth's Youth Commissioner, Tom Hayes, chose Douglas as his guest.

Douglas, who has been a Scout Leader for over 40 years, and is a District Commissioner in Kenilworth, described the event: "Firstly to be able to attend this once in a lifetime concert for such a special event was an honour. We travelled to Windsor early afternoon on the 7th May and had arranged (for a donation) to park at a Scout Hut about 20 minutes' walk to Windsor Castle. We arrived at the East Lawn about 4pm and the atmosphere was already buzzing with warm-up acts and rehearsals as well as Radio Two DJ, Scott Mills, commentating. It was great to see many members of the Royal Family in the Royal Box for the occasion – King Charles looked as though he was really enjoying himself. The time went so quickly it was all over at 10pm. It took rather longer to exit than anticipated and we finally arrived home at 2am. This set the scene perfectly for a royal, country garden celebration. Some residents also took part in a wreath making competition, Diane and Peter Gray winning first prize for their beautiful wreath as judged by residents just before the celebrations kicked off.

On arrival guests were greeted with a drink and a beautifully decorated cupcake each made by Tracey Rathbone. A jam packed afternoon followed with live music from Delta State Music, colourful crown creations on the children's craft table, a selection of games (the childrens v adults football match taken particularly seriously by the adults!) on the field and 'Queen' Nuala Clamp taking first prize for the best outfit, looking supremely elegant. We marked the historic event with the planting of a tree and presentational plaque (poignantly next to the tree planted last year for the Platinum jubilee celebrations), giving specially designed mugs to all the children and, of course, a rousing rendition of the National Anthem.

Ten Facts about King Charles III

- 1. Charles Philip Arthur George was born at 9:14 PM on 14th November 1948, to Princess Elizabeth and Prince Philip, at Buckingham Palace in London.
- 2. He has been heir apparent to the throne since he was three years old.
- 3. In 1967, King Charles studied archaeology, anthropology, and history at Trinity College. He graduated from the University of Cambridge, in 1970, with a Bachelor of Arts degree, making him the first heir to earn a university degree.
- 4. He can speak Welsh. He spent two months learning the language in 1969, as he prepared to become the Prince of Wales. He still speaks it today.
- 5. While serving in the military in the 1970s, he trained as a jet and helicopter pilot and became a confident diver. At just 23 years old, he earned his RAF wings as flight lieutenant Wales, becoming the first member of the royal family to achieve such an honour.
- 6. A keen water colour painter, a published author and a music lover who can play three instruments: cello, piano and trumpet. He has presented the BBC weather forecast, for Scotland, in May 2012 and made a guest appearance in Eastenders, with Camilla, to celebrate Queen Elizabeth II's platinum jubilee.
- 7. As Prince of Wales, His Majesty has been instrumental in establishing more than 20 charities over 40 years, and has worked closely with many organisations, publicly supporting a wide variety of causes relating to the environment, rural communities, the built environment, the arts, healthcare, and education. Passionate about the environment he spoke out against plastic pollution as early as 1970 and has planted many trees during his royal engagements.
- 8. Aged 73 King Charles III is the oldest monarch ever to be crowned in British history. He became King on 8th September 2022, after the death of his mother, the Queen, at Balmoral.
- 9. As head of the Commonwealth, King Charles III is monarch of each of the Commonwealth realms Antigua & Barbuda, Australia, Bahamas, Belize, Canada, Grenada, Jamaica, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, St. Kitts & Nevis, St. Lucia, St. Vincent & the Grenadines, the Solomon Islands, Tuvalu, and the United Kingdom. As King, he is the only person in the UK who can travel abroad in the Commonwealth without passport and drive without a licence.
- 10. King Charles III has two children Princes William and Harry and five grandchildren George, Charlotte, Louis, Archie, and Lilibet. Prince William is next in line to become King and was named the Prince of Wales in 2022.



HS2 Update.

A frustrating time for observers of this project as the reports of instructions from HM Treasury to delay / postpone / put an annual spending cap on the project cannot be verified. This might mean that the Euston to Old Oak Common section might not be completed as phase one, but that is not officially confirmed, we understand.

Locally this may mean that works to excavate the route under the A46 may be delayed, with the expected delays that this might create being postponed too. Readers will have seen progress of the excavation of the line of route up to the A46 southern boundary and the progress on the alignment of the track bed.

A planning application has been approved by Warwick District Council to create a 4 way roundabout just south of the new A46 roundabout which would give separate access to the proposed Rugby Farmers Market and also to the HS2 compound via a new route: ref planning application W20/2013. The timescale for this is assumed to be after the A46 roundabout is completed, but look out for further information as the construction of this is bound to affect traffic movements.

HS2 are apparently to request planning permission to construct a T junction onto the C32/ Birmingham Road, just north of where the roundabout in the paragraph above will be sited. It was explained to me at the drop in session last year concerning the revised access route to the compound, that this is a "belt and braces" application in case the roundabout does not go ahead to meet the HS2 timescale, possibly commencing October 2023. This should hopefully take traffic off the B4115 and prevent further damage to the road surface there as this will give access for HS2 traffic to the compound and the line of route. This T junction should be a temporary measure until the roundabout is constructed. Sadly, this has the potential to destroy more length of hedgerow and some trees, although there are not as many along that stretch of road.
