

Stoneleigh Community Orchard Update

It was with some relief that storm "Amy", the first named storm of the autumn came and went without significant damage to the orchard. This was largely due to the diligence of our apple picking team in taking the weight off heavily laden tree branches.

I am encouraged to report that the picking team has recently broadened to include more people from outside the village, specifically John Elton and Peter Johnstone from Kenilworth and Cubbington respectively as well as David and Kim Sibley from Leamington and Elaine James from Coventry. I would also like to thank our regular team members Paul Britten, Mike Evans and Melanie Braly who joined board members Quentin Compton-Bishup, John Churchley, Amanda Freeman and myself to complete the picking of 2025. October 7th, also witnessed the completion of cider pressing which was achieved at a rapid pace considering the manual nature of the task and the quantity pressed (1700 litres of cider and 50 litres of perry).

Thanks are also extended to Bev Davis, the Almshouses' clerk for allowing us to harvest cooking apples from their gardens. Cooking apples have a sharp taste to them which complements the bitter and sweet tastes provided by other varieties from the orchard and are useful in the blending process. Particularly when our orchard sharp varieties under produce as has been the case this year. I also observed that the apple trees of the Almshouses are fine old specimens that are most probably Bramleys of indeterminate age and complement the historic setting perfectly. They therefore need to be preserved and cherished going forward.

With regards to Stoneleigh cider, I can report that as this article is being written, John and myself are collecting further bottles from the Pershore bottling plant. This should cover demand over the late autumn and winter months. Do let me know at the email address below if you would like to purchase any bottled Stoneleigh cider. The price remains £3.50 per bottle and £40 for a case of 12.

Saturday December 20th We will be singing at the Lions Carol Concert in Kenilworth Castle, which starts at 6pm.


Sunday December 21st The choir will be taking part in Stoneleigh Church Carol Service.

HS2 Update

Cllr Hancox advised that the 4113 will be closed for 4 weeks from 5th January and again in March to complete the other side of the road. Sara Louise will present to the November meeting the next steps. Dalehouse Lane will also be closed for 14 months from 15th January. Cllr Hancox will collate a report for Cllr P Redford to present at the SAG meeting.

Birmingham Road Closure Update

Cllr Edwards advised there will be no closure, WCC will use HS2 funds to add speed calming measures including speed cushions, bollards and other schemes. Item to be changed to Birmingham Road Traffic Improvement Measures. Cllr Edwards to investigate further.

HS2 update

As all residents will have seen, works continue on the project. The Ashow Road overbridge is open but there may be some disruption in the future to make minor alignments. There are anticipated road closures on the B4113 (the road past the NAEC main gate) which will most likely take place early next year. This road is likely be closed in two phases, initially east of the main gate (so no access from Stoneleigh) and then west (from Westhill Road) so look out for more information.

Also expected in 2026 will be the long-term closure of Dalehouse Lane to complete the overbridge and road realignment. This will be something like 14 months.

Looking at the bigger picture, it is still not clear when the line will become operational after the announcement by the Secretary of State for Transport, Heidi Alexander, to conduct further reviews and look for cost savings. So frustrating for residents!
