

Stoneleigh Community Orchard

s the festive period approaches, we can reflect on the orchard's year to date, which commenced back in early January 2025 with our spectacular and highly successful orchard wassail. This event demonstrated the value of marketing and promotion, and the orchard directors agreed that this event should occur every other year, which means that the next wassail is scheduled for January 2027. In May, we had the blossom festival which seems to have snowballed exponentially in terms of popularity and attendance. The orchard directors will be meeting shortly to fix a date for the blossom festival 2026, the outcome of which will be reported in the February 2026 edition of the S&A News.

On considering the challenges the orchard has faced throughout 2025, the foremost of these was the apple ermine moth infestation that threatened to decimate the orchard trees and could still be a problem in 2026. The orchard directors are already taking measures to address this proactively, although outcomes in nature can of course be unpredictable. The elements have also played their hand within the orchard, with high winds toppling trees heavily laden with fruit, which elicited a firm response. We of course have our onerous and growing harvest to manage, which has been met with the strength and enthusiasm of our orchard team who have risen to the challenge admirably.

Villagers, as well as those walking in the meadow, will have noticed that our resident wicker man (otherwise known as "Wicker the Cider Nicker") who who had recently been stationed by the Motslow Hill bridge, has now been moved. It seems that his enthusiasm for Halloween was countered by possibilities surrounding Bonfire Night! He currently resides under the boughs of a hornbeam tree in the garden to the rear of 5 Church Lane, like a metaphorical traveller at a bus stop awaiting the seasons to change and, more specifically, the return of spring, when he can get dressed up once again to participate in village events.

Bottled Stoneleigh cider is still available to purchase. The price remains at £3.50 per bottle and £40 for a case of 12. It is my belief that that they would

make excellent Christmas presents, perhaps forming part of a festive hamper.

Finally, on behalf of the orchard team, I would like to wish everyone season's greetings and a happy new year!

t's a wet Saturday evening. People need cheering up. Where can they go? The answer – at least on 18th October – was the warm embrace of the thousand-year-old St Mary's Church in Stoneleigh! There, Stoneleigh Male Voice Choir were gathered with their friends from Cancer Research (UK) Kenilworth to bring some warmth and joy to the gathered throng in an effort to **Stand Up to Cancer** by raising funds for vital research into a disease which has pretty well affected us all in one way or another. How did they do it – by raising the rafters with singing!

But wait, could the SMVC do that on their own? Well no! In addition to the enthusiastic and participative audience, they were graced once again with the presence of guest singers, welcoming back the wonderfully talented Cwm Dare Voices from the deepest valleys of Wales, with conductor Dr Michael Thomas MBE and accompanist Rhian Grundy-Lewis. The Stoneleigh boys opened up the show, under the control (so he thinks!) of MD Kevin Stannard and the eagle-eyed batonist, conductor Judy Hadfield, with "I Wish I Knew How" (we wish we did too!), by talking to a "Moon River" until they met a "Bridge Over Troubled Waters", but they still "Can't Help Falling In Love". No wonder they finished up "All By Myself"!

You need to follow that lot with something rousing and moving. The building shook as Cwm Dare Voices came in with "Men of Harlech", their mellifluous and dramatic tones stirring all present. Beautifully projected versions of "Take Me Home" and "Rachie" followed. The Voices performed the opening set in the second half with the traditional "Carrickfergus" and "Tydi a Rhoddaist". SMVC concluded the concert with four finely sung songs, including "Ave Verum Corpus" and a selection from "Les Misérables", which they sang magnificently. All came together at the end to sing a special arrangement of "What Shall We Do with the Drunken Sailor", involving all the gathered "sailors" in the audience, one or two who frankly were showing signs of being completely scuppered, possibly on account of the interval refreshments generously supplied by the CR(UK) Kenilworth team.

The choir were particularly touched and proud to have Life President, Alan Biddle, as a guest in the gathered throng. It was a great pleasure to see him there.

The generosity of the audience in applause showed no bounds and raised approximately £2,700 for Cancer Research. A great big thank you to all for that.

Such was the great joy and elation following the concert that everyone had to repair back to Stoneleigh Village Club, which generously hosted a post-concert supper, with a few ales to help the recovery of busy voices. The lubrication worked brilliantly, causing more singing far into the night until sadly it was time to bid a fond farewell to the outstanding Cwm Dare Voices, wishing them a safe journey back to the valleys we all love.

The SMVC would like to thank all those who supported the evening – Stoneleigh Church, Stoneleigh Club and especially our friends from Cwm Dare Voices, who added such brilliance and talent to the evening.

Along the route, we experienced varied terrain, spectacular scenery and local culture, camping overnight or staying in traditional mountain lodges.



When Life Hands You a Nail...

any of you will know that I've recently been on compassionate leave for a month. It wasn't a holiday (though I did drink enough tea to keep Yorkshire Tea in business for another decade). It was a time of deep grief and quiet reflection for my wife and me.

We had spent a long time preparing to adopt a child. We prayed, trained, filled out more forms than I thought humanly possible, and prepared our home and hearts. And then, when the news came that it wouldn't happen, it felt as though our world collapsed. In a strange and painful way, it felt like losing a child we had already begun to love. The grief was real. Heavy. Unexpectedly loud.

But during this time, I learned something strangely beautiful about grief. Grief doesn't get smaller. Life grows around it. This idea comes from Lois Tonkin's model of grief, and I found it deeply comforting. We imagine grief shrinking like a forgotten jumper in the tumble dryer. But, in reality, the "grief-ball" stays the same size; it's life that gets bigger.

Jesus said something remarkably similar: "Stand firm, and you will win life" (Luke 21:19). He was talking about holding on during trials – not giving up, not collapsing inward – and discovering that life somehow expands around the pain.

A few days ago, Gordon Gatward, our wonderful churchwarden, shared a perfect illustration. When the team were cutting down the ash tree in the churchyard (thanks to ash dieback, the tree equivalent of a cold that refuses to leave), the chainsaw hit a buried metal nail. Someone, decades ago, must have hammered that nail into the trunk – perhaps to hang a sign saying "Please don't climb the tree", which of course made every child immediately climb the tree.

But here's the point: the nail didn't go away. It didn't melt or shrink. Instead, the tree grew around it. Year after year, ring after ring, season after season, the tree kept growing. The wound didn't disappear, but life became bigger than the nail.

And so it is with us. You may have lost someone dearly loved, and yet found life expanding through grandchildren, friendships, new beginnings.

You may have been betrayed, and yet later discovered a community that cherishes you. You may have watched long-held dreams crumble, only to see new ones sprout in unexpected soil.

The "nail" doesn't always leave. But, by God's grace, life grows around it. So, if you're carrying grief – recent or long-buried – may Jesus' words meet you gently.

Stand firm, and you will win life. Not by pretending the nail isn't there, not by shrinking your world, but by allowing life – your life – to expand slowly, quietly, beautifully around it.

Amen.
